Prior approval of the Dean must be obtained for each course (application forms are available in the Dean's Office). Courses not so approved by the Dean in advance may not be accepted in transfer.

Grades of "C-" or better must be earned.

SECTION III To Do Completed by Doon's Office

Normally students will not be able to transfer more than a total of 9 hours of approved transient study during the entire degree program at Creighton. In addition, students may not ordinarily earn transient study credit for courses regularly offered at Creighton University. Students must adhere to the degree requirements regarding minimum required credits at Creighton and should consult the College in which they are enrolled for additional transient study restrictions.
