It is our pleasure to inform you that the AOTA Residency Program Review Committee has completed its review of your application and the report of the site visit conducted on May 30-31, 2017 and has granted approval of Creighton University Pediatric Occupational Therapy Residency Program as an Approved AOTA Residency Site in the area of pediatrics effective June 14, 2017. Congratulations!

Approval is granted for a period of 10 years through June 14, 2027. Creighton University Pediatric Occupational Therapy Residency Program is authorized to accept residents under the auspices of this AOTA Residency Program as long as you continue to meet the requirements upon which the initial Approved AOTA Residency Site status was based and abide by any additions or revisions to the requirements as notified by AOTA.

As identified in the initial application, Bobbi Greiner, OTD, OTR/L will be the AOTA contact and responsible person for all communications related to the Approved Residency Site's status. A change in responsible personnel by Creighton University will require advance notification to and approval by AOTA.

Creighton University Pediatric Occupational Therapy Residency Program will be required to complete a brief annual update and submit an annual fee by August 30 each year. After 5 years, in January 2022, an interim report is required, but no site visit will be required unless requested by the Residency Program Review Committee. After 10 years, in January 2027, a complete application is required, but a site visit is not required unless requested by the Residency Program Review Committee.

AOTA reserves the right to monitor compliance with Residency Program requirements and to investigate complaints of possible violations therein. In addition to documentation and records review, investigation may include an on-site audit at the expense of Creighton University. AOTA reserves the right to withdraw Residency Status if Creighton University Pediatric Occupational Therapy Residency Program (1) provides false information on its original or subsequent documentation or communication, or (2) fails to conduct its Residency Program in compliance with AOTA requirements.

Your decision to become an Approved AOTA Residency Site is a demonstration of your commitment to meet the professional development needs of occupational therapy practitioners and strengthen the profession of occupational therapy in the area of pediatrics.
