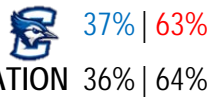


Creighton’s seniors are diverse in a variety of dimensions.

Senior Diversity: Gender

Of the six hundred and five Creighton seniors participating in the survey, 63% were female and 37% were male. This is consistent with ratios at the national level (NATION*).

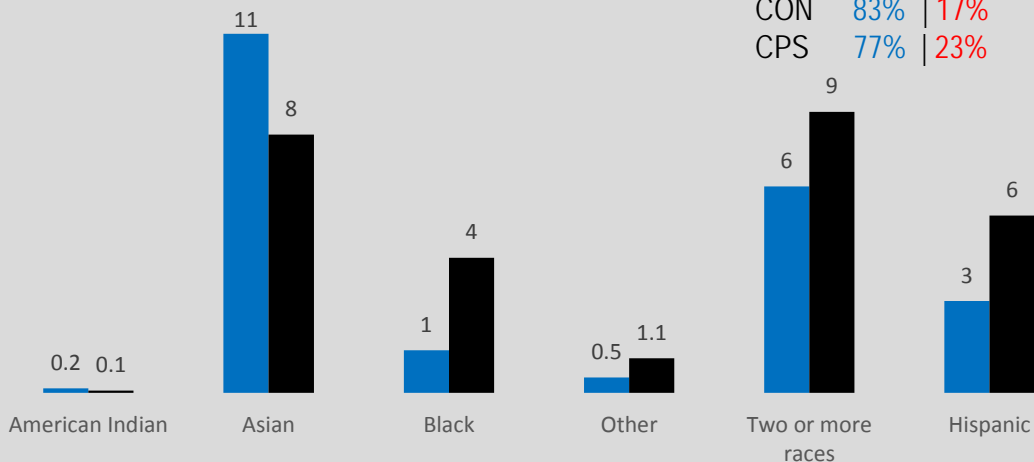
Senior Diversity: Race/Ethnicity

78% of Creighton's respondents identified as white; 22% of respondents represented the remaining ethnicities. Though the overall diversity at Creighton is less than that at the national level, Asian and American Indian diversity at Creighton is higher than the national level by 3% and 0.1% respectively.

Senior Diversity: Religious Affiliation

Over half (55%) of Creighton seniors identified as Roman Catholic; 21% as other non-denomination Christian; 5% as other religion (e.g., Buddhist, Hindu, Jewish, Muslim, and other). 18% reported no religious affiliation.



Catholic | No Religion



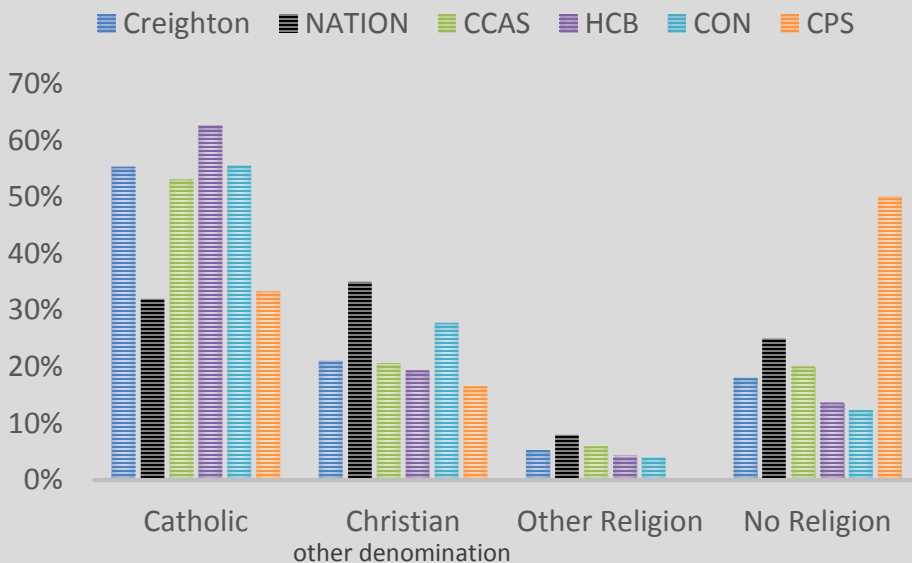

Catholic remains dominant in all colleges. After Christianity, “None” is the next largest religious affiliation group reported, both at Creighton and at the national level (**NATION***).
