Financial Aid Distribution 2001-02

Creighton's Financial Aid office distributed over \$111 million to enrolled students in the 2001-02 academic year, up from \$103 million in 2000-01 and \$96 million in 1999-00. The overall composition of the dollars included:

\$16 million in Grants	\$16 million in Scholarships
\$68 million in Loans	\$3 million in Student Employment
\$4 million in Remissions	\$4 million in Tuition Grants
