UPDATE ON SERVICE-LEARNING

FROM THE OFFICE OF ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AND ASSESSMENT



ASSESSMENT ESSENTIAL TO COMMUNITY-BASED SERVICE-LEARNING

Every summer, three professors and a group of students travel to one of the poorest areas of Lima, Peru. Working with Kyle Woolley (Sociology) and Ryan Spangler (Modern Languages, Spanish), Tom Kelly (Theology) shares: "What we have consistently seen over time and in different countries is a depth of learning that we cannot replicate in the classroom. The students' direct contacts with people, which must occur outside the classroom, engages them in the 'deep learning' that epitomizes the Ignatian pedagogical paradigm of experience, reflection, action." Kelly has implemented service-learning into a Faculty Led Program Abroad (FLPA) for more than 10 years.

Three assessment tools of community-based service-learning are essential to this FLPA program. First, journal questions, which are specific and clear, accompany the readings and experience and are centered on particular themes and realities. Second, communal reflection allows for students to share their perspectives, listen to other perspectives and validate their own experiences in the midst of a community. The final assessment, an integration paper, reveals whether the students' encounter with the community was enhanced by the academic coursework and vice-versa.

PRESIDENT'S HONOR ROLL

The Office of Academic Excellence and Assessment gathered and submitted the 2012-2013 service-learning institutional data for the 2014 President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll program, managed by the Corporation for National and Community Service. The Honor Roll recognizes higher education institutions in four categories: general community service, interfaith community service, economic opportunity and education. A special thank you to the individuals from many Creighton offices, colleges and schools who helped compile the data for our 2012-2013 submission.



Last year, our joint effort in collecting the service-learning data was instrumental to celebrating the success of more than 4,750 Creighton students engaged in more than 471,000 hours of community service in 2012-2013 — an all-time high in our reporting. The Honor Roll annually highlights the role colleges and universities play in solving community problems and placing more students on a lifelong path of civic engagement by recognizing institutions that achieve meaningful, measurable outcomes in the communities they serve.

PROGRAM SPOTLIGHTS

Continuing our series highlighting the programs in which our students have participated in service, we feature the Youth Leadership Omaha and FLPA Discovering Peru: Church, Language and Society in Context programs.

Youth Leadership Omaha, sponsored by the Heider College of Business, is an interactive leadership development program, which informs, motivates and increases the leadership awareness of selected high school sophomores through issue-oriented seminars and interaction with community decision-makers. Discovering Peru:

Language, Church and Society in Context recently completed a very successful summer 2014 program and has begun planning for the next learning community in the summer of 2015. In addition to offering nine credits over six weeks, this past summer, faculty and students engaged a new community-based learning site at the Jesuit Parish of El Agostino in Lima and expanded home stays from one day a week to two days a week at the request of the community!

Additionally, faculty added a two-day retreat on a beach in the northern part of Peru to help students appropriate and integrate a very intense immersion experience into their lives. More program information.

METRO-AREA COALITION FOR SERVICE-LEARNING NEWS



Creighton is a member of the Metropolitan-Area Coalition for Service-Learning (MACSL), along with representatives from the College of Saint Mary, Metropolitan Community College, Nebraska Methodist College, University of Nebraska at Omaha, University of Nebraska Medical Center and Iowa Western Community College.

The coalition seeks to: (1) increase collaboration and share selected service-learning programming among seven metro-area universities; (2) offer coordinated programming on a selected topic each semester; and (3) bring university and college resources together in educating students and the public about selected significant local, national and international issues.

CITIZEN ENGAGEMENT IN HIGHER EDUCATION




NEBRASKA APPLESEED
