

PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

Continuing our series highlighting the programs in which our students have participated in service, we feature the **Heider College of Business Community Assistance Teams** and the **Cortina Community** programs.



The [Heider College of Business Community Assistance Teams](#) work with community organizations on projects that are in need of the "business skills" the students are developing in the classroom. Undergraduate and graduate business students provide assistance with marketing plans; the use of social networking; designing a system to begin a new service or program; and revamping financial structures.

Additionally, the students have the opportunity to engage with organizations focused on improving their community and gain an appreciation for the power of teamwork and management skills in making the world a better place.

The [Cortina Community](#) is an academic, service-based, living-learning community within the Department of Residence Life that nurtures growth in students through



service of faith, the promotion of justices and the well-educated solidarity within an intentional residential community. The program, which takes place during the academic year, focuses on the academic and service experiences in the Omaha community. Students participate in weekly community discussions and service, coupled with retreats, immersions, speakers, and more, to facilitate an understanding of the self in relation to a call to do justice in the context of community. In the [International Journal of Research on Service-Learning and Community Engagement](#) (IJRSLE), Vol. 3, No. 1, the article, [*An Overlooked Lens: Applying Structuration Theory, Actor-Network Theory, and Theories of Space to Service-Learning.*](#)



Although service-learning is clearly a social phenomenon involving interactions between people in social environments, little scholarly attention has been given to the ways in which sociological theories illuminate how service-learning is enacted and sustained in schools. Important aspects of academic service-learning highlighted include areas that other theories have missed such as how service-learning actors must exploit enabling aspects of school structures and spaces to overcome constraints, the importance of non-human agents in service-learning programs, and challenges service-learning advocates face in reconfiguring school spaces for service-learning. The author also describes and examines limits of each theory as well as implications for research and practice.
