INVITED TO SERVE: PROJECT HOMELESS CONNECT OMAHA

On any given night in the Omaha/Council Bluffs area, it is estimated there are approximately 1500 homeless in shelters and on the streets. Project Homeless Connect Omaha (PHCO) allows these individuals access to important services which improve their lives on the streets. The one-day event serves as a “one-stop shop,” connecting homeless individuals to services including housing, healthcare, legal resources, Social Security, and food-stamp benefits.



SUBMISSION OF 2016 DATA

The 2016 submission has yet to be announced. Creighton University reported **more than 1.25 million total student service hours for the reporting year (2014-2015)**. The actual number is 1,338,234 hours. The report shows that **4,799 Creighton students engaged in academic, co-curricular or community service; 72% (3,470) of those Creighton students engaged in some form of academic service-learning and 3,736 students participated in more than 20 hours of service in a given semester.**



PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

Continuing our series highlighting the programs in which our students have participated in service, we feature a **senior perspective course with focus on poverty in America** and the **Spring Break Service and Justice Trips** programs.

During the summer pre-session, Creighton offers a senior perspective course, [Poverty in America](#), in which students travel to West Virginia and live with a community that serves those of the area in various forms of outreach.

There are opportunities for students to assist in home repair, tutor children, gather and cook for community night, visit the elderly and/or homebound, and come to know the particular strengths and perspectives of those who deal with poverty day-to-day, all of their lives. Another component of the course is to understand the systematic causes of poverty experiences in the area.



The community students emphasizes the importance of simplicity, prayer, service, community and sustainability; they integrate these into the work they do in the surrounding areas. Nearly 150 Creighton students participated in the [Schlegel Center for Service & Justice's 34th annual Spring Break Trips](#) which provided students an opportunity to live, work and learn in communities. During the week, students engaged in dialogue, social justice advocacy and service work at 19 different sites around the country, including Memphis, Minneapolis, Albuquerque, Cleveland, and along the southern border with Mexico.



In addition, SCSJ had teamed up with Abide Omaha, a nonprofit center, which reaches out to neighbors and helps weave together components of a safer and healthier neighborhood.

METRO-AREA COALITION FOR SERVICE-LEARNING NEWS


