The Leadership Scholars program incorporates transformational leadership principles combined with Ignatian values as students progress through a 4 year BSN program.

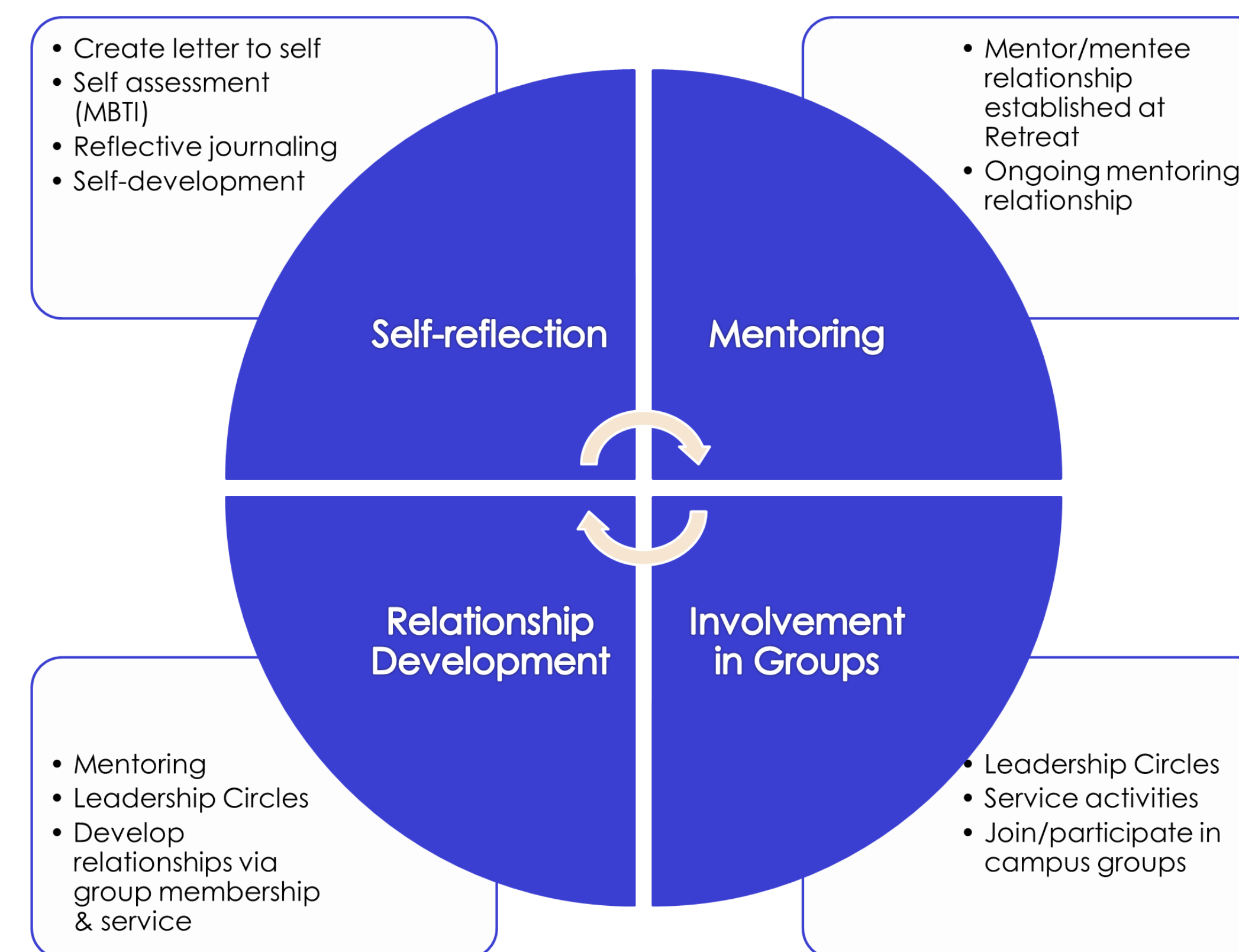
IOM *Future of Nursing* report recommends we “prepare and enable nurses to lead change to advance health” (2011, p. 14).
