

## Creighton University Baccalaureate Social Work Program Assessment of Student Learning Outcomes Academic year: 2017-2018

Creighton University's Social Work program is fully accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE). In order to provide transparency and accountability to the public, student learning outcome assessment data is provided annually on our website. The below table summarizes our student learning outcomes for the 9 competencies integral to the CSWE 2015 Educational Policy and Accreditation Standards (EPAS), as well as a 10<sup>th</sup> competency that reflects the context of the Jesuit, Catholic University in which the Social Work program operates. The competencies provide an outcome based evaluation that practice skills can be developed and measured against, guiding the Social Work program's curriculum and assessment. Students demonstrate the below competencies in both direct practice as well as in-direct measurements; across the dimensions of knowledge, values, skills, and cognitive & affective processing.
