A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Additionally last semester we collaborated with a number of groups on campus (Inter Residence Hall Government, Marketing & Communications, Violence Intervention & Prevention, CCSJ, and DoIT, just to name a few!) to not only plan and execute events, but leave a lasting impact on the Creighton community. Most importantly, we are making sure that your voices are heard by being present at your events, representing CSU outside of the office, and taking your suggestions weekly at Program Board's Wednesdays After Class events.

ISSUES WE ADDRESSED

BLUE CROSS BLUE SHIELD ADS

Resolution 15-01, our first resolution of the semester, was sponsored by Medical School representatives and requested the removal of Blue Cross Blue Shield advertisements from Creighton affiliated venues. This request was initiated due to disagreements between CHI/CUMC and BCBS at the time. This resolution was approved by the Board on a vote of 33-2-1.

GREEN SPACE

Resolution 15–02 and 15–03 both came from the Campus Planning Committee with help from the External Affairs Committee. The new Campus Master Plans proposed by Creighton was presented to the student body last March and consequently inspired Resolution 15–02. Of the two master plans, the Board of Representatives felt that the plan that included more green space represented more accurately what the student body would benefit the most from. This resolution was approved by the Board on a vote of 35–0–1.

OUTDOOR SEATING

With better weather in the spring, the Board also recognized a need for more outdoor seating available on campus. Resolution 15–03 suggested possible areas for outdoor seating and reasons why we see a need. In June, we received communication from John Wilhelm, the Vice President for Administration that new furnishing for four areas on campus will be ordered. This resolution was approved by the Board on a vote of 35–0–1.

COUNSELING CENTER REFORM

Resolution 15–04 was purposed as the result of a waiting list that was implemented by Creighton Counseling Center in March/April. With a need to serve the students best, we suggested that Creighton allocate more resources to the counseling center to take better care of our students. This resolution was approved by the Board on a vote of 30–0–1.
