Students who volunteer to put forth their time and energy for the success of this event will be benefited with the opportunity to work "hand-in-hand" with some of Omaha/Council Bluff's community of adults with special needs, as well as with other Creighton students and student organizations with similar hearts and hands for service and love. Currently, the Ollie Webb Center, Inc. and the Better Living Inc. are two organizations sharing information about this event.

Hand-In-Hand Mission Statement:

Creighton University's spiritual tradition thrives in the view of Ignatius of Loyola that we "find God in all." As "men and women for and with others," we strive to welcome and serve those with special needs and different abilities and gifts to join us for a day of hospitality, community, and creativity. We want to work with existing organizations at Creighton and in Omaha/Council Bluffs area who accompany handicapped and specially-abled adults and who have ongoing, established relationships with them. In order to nurture those relationships, we will host an annual event, "Hand-In-Hand," that shows genuine love and care for those with special needs. This will be an opportunity to come together for companionship, food, music, laughter, listening, and reflection. The event may incorporate interactive games, music, arts and crafts, dancing, and other creative offerings that will celebrate the gifts and goodness of our guests. In this way, we hope to incarnate our mission to live our lives "ad majorem Dei gloriam."
