Overview and Objectives

Day, C.D.A., B.S., dental hygienists and assistants will review dentition, tooth decay, plaque removal techniques, toothbrushes, fluoride applications, interdental aids and the importance of motivating patients in a plaque control program.

- Three ways for patients to receive fluoride
- The difference between electric toothbrushes and comparison with manual ones
