

Dear Parent/ Guardian:

Thank you for considering Classic Upward Bound at Creighton University for your student!

Classic Upward Bound is a federally funded program, sponsored by the United States Department of Education. The Upward Bound program based at Creighton University works with over one hundred 9th -12th grade students in the Omaha metropolitan area. Classic Upward Bound assists selected participants in completing secondary school, enroll in post-secondary school, and complete a bachelor's degree by providing intense academic, career, and personal advising; academic instruction in language arts, mathematics and, science; tutorial services; college credit courses after their senior year of high school, cultural and recreational activities throughout the year.

Classic Upward Bound participants must meet at least one of the qualifying criteria: family income guidelines as set forth by the federal government and/or neither parent may possess a four-year college degree. Our focus is to target, select, and help those students that have the desire and potential to succeed in college. We seek those students with academic, social and/or cultural needs.

Interested students and parents are expected to make a serious commitment to the program. Students meet a minimum of two hours a week for academic support and tutoring as well as meet with their designated Upward Bound Coordinator for one on one advising. In addition, they are required to attend the Saturday Academy on the first and third Saturday of the month, where we include ACT preparation classes, supplemental instruction, field trips, etc. During the summer, students may be eligible to attend a six-week residential academic component, which is highly rewarding. As long as they meet the requirements of the program during the academic year and summer academy, they can remain in Upward Bound until graduation.

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS & INFORMATION

Directions for Applying:

Return the items mentioned below in **bold type** to your high school counselor or to the Upward Bound office.

(1.) Application

- a. The student and parent(s) must complete and sign the **Student Participant Application Form.**
- b. The parent(s) must complete and sign the **School Records Release form** authorizing Classic Upward Bound to obtain copies of their child's **High School Transcripts** and progress reports.
- c. The student must have the **Evaluation form** completed by his/her Guidance Counselor.
- d. The student must have the **Teacher Evaluation form** completed by his/her English, Math, and Science Teachers.
- e. The parent(s) must provide a source of verification for family income. *One of the following* sources must accompany the application: a) A copy of the most recent parent or family federal income tax form showing **TAXABLE INCOME**, or a statement from the Social Security Administration, or the Department of Social Services.

(2.) Transcript

Prior to an interview, the parent(s) must obtain a recent copy of their child's current **Transcript** from his /her counselor.

Applications are screened and those applicants who meet the criteria based upon family income and parental education guidelines will be granted an interview where both the applicant and the parent will be interviewed. Upon completion of the interview process, a final selection will be made. Those selected will be contacted via letter of acceptance. Classic Upward Bound accepts approximately 15-20 students per year from all nine schools, so if your student is not selected, we encourage him/her to reapply next year.

The application must be completed and returned accompanying all supporting documentation, forms, and/or letters to the Classic Upward Bound Program office before a student will be considered for admittance.

ALL INFORMATION IS CONFIDENTIAL

Please note that all information provided in this application is protected by the privacy act and is not specifically reported to the federal government for U.S. Department of Education. However, the Department of Education does have the authority to gather statistical data about the program participants in order to improve and measure the success of the Classic Upward Bound Program.

CLASSIC UPWARD BOUND FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT IS CLASSIC UPWARD BOUND?

Classic Upward Bound is a federally funded program that assists Omaha high school students in achieving academic skills and personal growth necessary for successful completion of high school and admission to a four-year college/university. Upward Bound programs supplement the student's high school experience with academic preparation, career exploration and self-development opportunities. Classic Upward Bound at Creighton University is for students who demonstrate a desire for higher education.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- Students who have earned at least a minimum grade point average of a 2.50 at the time of the application
- ☑ Students enrolled in the 9th -11th grade. (Upward Bound does not accept students that have attained Senior status)
- ☑ Students who are a first generation college-bound student (neither parent has earned a four-year college degree)
- ☑ Students who meet the U.S. Department of Education income guidelines
- ☑ Students that show a need for Classic Upward Bound services.
- ☑ Active participation in the Classic Upward Bound Academic year and the Summer Residential Academy components

WHAT ARE THE SERVICES?

WHAT ARE THE ACADEMIC YEAR REQUIREMENTS?

Tutoring:

☑ Students are required to attend a minimum of two hours of individual tutoring per week.

- ✓ Students are required to attend classes from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on the first and third Saturdays of each month.
- ✓ Supplemental instructional courses include, but are not limited to the following:

Math: Algebra, Geometry, Calculus, Trigonometry

Science: Biology, Chemistry, Physics

■ English: Reading/Writing Skills, Word Study, Writing & Composition, Basic Reference and Speech

Social Studies: American/World History, American Government, Business, Human Relations

WHAT IS THE SUMMER ACADEMY?

Classic Upward Bound offers a six-week residential summer component on the campus of Creighton University. Participants are provided an opportunity to stay in one of Creighton's resident halls, attend classes, and gain exposure to various facets of "college life." Students attend an average of 5-6 hours of instruction per day. The classes are designed to simulate a collegiate experience. *Participants who complete the program at graduation are eligible to register for one college class and earn credit that is transferable to their college of choice.

(*Eligibility is determined by academic need (i.e. grade point average, participation, and recommendations.)
