Welcome Back! We trust you had a relaxing and productive summer. We are eager to renew acquaintances and meet new faces and we hope to see you in the library or in offices, classrooms, and hallways.

The web site (<http://hsl.creighton.edu>) for the Health Sciences Library (HSL) provides information about hours and policies as well as contact information. You will soon be able to follow us on Facebook.

Faculty, staff and students must login to use services and connect to online resources from off campus. See <http://hsl.creighton.edu/services/distanceeducation> for more information.

The HSL has extensive print and online collections of books and journals, as well as simulation models and other multimedia resources. Library services include circulation and reserves, reference and research assistance, instruction in use of databases and bibliographic management software, expert database searches and consultations, interlibrary loan, community outreach, assistance with using library printers, copiers and scanners, and support for using resources for mobile devices.

The HSL has over 40 computers located on two floors, including 16 in the library's computer classroom. The HSL users log on to library computers using their Creighton NetID and password; guests log on by obtaining a temporary guest account at the Service Desk. We also have laptops and iPads for check-out.

We strive to make the library a welcoming place to study. Food and covered drinks are permitted. There is a small coffee shop on the second floor. Wireless access is available throughout the library, and electrical outlets and data lines are provided wherever possible. Study areas include open seating, tables for collaborative study, and group study rooms.

We look forward to seeing you at the Health Sciences Library, and we hope you will feel free to ask questions and provide feedback on our services, collections and space.

### New NetBooks and iPads Available at Health Sciences Library

The Health Sciences Library / Learning Resources Center now has four **Lenovo ThinkPad X100e 11.5" NetBooks** available for two hour checkout (*library use only*) from the main desk. These are in addition to our four **Lenovo ThinkPad T500 15.5" Laptops**, also for two hour checkout (*library use only*). **Also available will be two 16GB Apple iPads.** Unlike our NetBooks and Laptops, *these can be checked out for three days at a time*, giving you the opportunity to decide for yourself if it's the next big trend in mobile computing.

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### Quick Tutorials Now Available

Write-N-Cite not working at 3 am? Can't remember how to find the download of that article? Well, this summer, the Reference staff has been working to create video tutorials to assist you. Videos on the library catalog (CLIC), RefWorks, searching and much more can now be accessed 24/7. These items are also available through the Creighton Digital Repository (CDR). The tutorials consist of short video clips (less than 5 minutes) and handouts. ## Save Money – Avoid Duplicate Subscriptions

Before you buy a journal for your department, whether for an individual or for a departmental library, check with the Health Sciences Library. The library has electronic access to many journals, which could save you money and storage space. You can check CLIC (the library catalog) and the electronic journal list to find out if we have the journal you need, and which years we have access to; or contact the library and we will look it up for you. If you have an existing departmental library, the Health Sciences Library will gladly review your title list to determine if we already have online access to the journals you are subscribing to, and provide you with links to those titles.

### Springer Collection: 19,000 E-Books



The **Health Sciences Library** and **Reinert-Alumni Library** have jointly purchased a package of approximately **19,000 electronic books** published by Springer Science+Business Media from 2005 through 2010. These books cover a wide range of subjects, including Behavioral Science; Biomedical and Life Science; Chemistry and Material Science; and Medicine.

Access to the collection is linked from the **Resources** page (<http://hsl.creighton.edu/resources>) of the Health Sciences Library web site. (Look for the **Springer ebooks** link in the **General ebook collections** section.) Once at **SpringerLink**, *any book or journal available to Creighton users is marked with a green square; a white square means no access.* Each title is also being added to **CLIC**, the Creighton Libraries' catalog.

In addition, Creighton users (after registering via the **MySpringerLink** tab) can download chapters or entire books in PDF format, without DRM limitations. A print-on-demand copy of any title (in black-and-white, although many illustrations in the PDFs are in color) can be ordered for \$24.95 including postage.
