The Creighton Integrity Council (CIC) provides opportunities for leadership and service in addition to *developing life-long skills in facilitating and resolving conflicts*, as well as *promoting civility and citizenship* within the University community.

Councils meet weekly to resolve alleged violations of the Code of Conduct.

THE ROLE OF THE COUNCIL

- Determines the facts in alleged policy violations
- Decides whether facts constitute a violation of the Code of Conduct or other applicable rules and regulations
- If a violation is found, recommends a reasonable sanction
- Be the programming board for the Center for Student Integrity

APPLICANTS

- Applicants for the CIC must be matriculated full-time undergraduate students
- Both on-campus and off-campus students may apply

SELECTION

- Upon receipt, your application will be reviewed. All candidates will be invited for an interview, and will sign up for an interview time when their application is submitted to Harper Center Suite 3060
- If selected for a CIC position, you will be required to participate in a training workshop and commit to weekly council meetings

Creighton University aims to be comprised of a diverse community of learners and educators; the CIC seeks to reflect this desire for diversity. Students of all backgrounds and interests are encouraged to apply.
