CARE Opportunities

In response to concerns that students who have been to CARE facing severe and long lasting disciplinary consequences, the Center for Student Integrity has developed a proposal for CARE Opportunities: An Alternative Course.

The concept of this program is inspired by a more traditional diversion program that qualifies individuals in the legal system that may opt into to remove a charge from their record.



Eligibility:

This program is an option for students who are compliant with University officials during the documentation of their CARE incident. Any student who is in failure to comply during an incident is not eligible for the program. Any student who has previously been to CARE is not eligible for the program.

Additionally, this program will be offered to students who do not have a significant disciplinary history, meaning any student that has been found responsible for multiple incidents for violating the Student Code of Conduct and would most likely be placed on disciplinary probation if found responsible for a new incident, would not be eligible for this program.

Program Description

Opportunities is a program consisting of five sessions that are 45-minutes to 1 hour in length. Each session would be taught by an expert/professional who educates students about the consequences that alcohol use can have on various aspects of one's life.

There will be a fee of a \$100 for the course.

Program Benefits

Students learn the facts about how alcohol can affect their lives in the short and long term. Students hear from professionals/experts in the fields about the reality of what happens when someone misuses or abuses of alcohol.

Upon successful completion a student's status will change from Disciplinary Probation to Disciplinary Reprimand.
