HOW TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES

Early registration for the Spring semester begins Wednesday, November 4. To register for classes, you will need to do the following:

1. Review the Course Schedule.

Course schedules are available on NEST (<http://thenest.creighton.edu>). We're providing you with the Spring 2010 *Accelerated* CREIGHTON and evening courses to ease your search. When choosing courses, note:

- 5-digit CRN number
- 3-letter course abbreviation
- Course number
- Course section letter
- Number of credit hours

2. Contact Your Advisor.

If you have a MAJOR advisor, you will need to contact him or her for your assigned Registration Time and PIN. Your major advisor will also assist you with choosing courses in your major area. If you do not have a major advisor, please contact your University College advisor.

Not sure if you have a major advisor or who your advisor is? Login to NEST. Choose the "Student Services" tab, click on "Student Records". Your advisor and curriculum information is listed on the "View Student Information" page.

3. Register for Classes.
