HOW TO REGISTER

Early registration for the Spring semester begins Wednesday, November 2 with current SENIORS. To register for classes:

1. Review the Course Schedule.

Search the Course Offerings on NEST (<http://thenest.creighton.edu>) to view all courses. Evening and accelerated courses are listed on page 6-7. You can check seat availability online on NEST or by contacting University College.

2. Contact Your Advisor.

If you have a MAJOR advisor, contact him or her for your assigned registration time and PIN. Your major advisor will also assist you with choosing courses in your major area. If you do not have a major advisor, contact your University College advisor.

Not sure if you have a major advisor? Login to NEST. Choose the "Student Services" tab, click on "Student Records". Your advisor and curriculum information is listed on the "View Student Information" page.

3. Register for Classes.

Email: Send an email to your University College advisor with your course selection. Include the 5-digit CRN number, 3-letter course abbreviation, course number and section letter. Don't forget to provide your NETID.

GET HELP WITH MY PAPER

Writing Center

Library Research Assistance Program

If you need someone to help you find your way around the library, guide you in your search for references or verify your citations, the Reinert Alumni Library can help.
