CHARACTER AND FITNESS REQUIREMENTS

Applicants who intend to practice law should be aware that admission to the bar in all states involves character, fitness and other qualifications. You are encouraged to consult the National Conference of Bar Examiners at www.ncbex.org and the bar examiners in the jurisdiction(s) in which you wish to practice law to determine what those requirements are in the particular jurisdiction(s). Applicants are encouraged to consult with an official of the bar examiners in the jurisdiction(s) as necessary to ascertain whether any past conduct could keep them from becoming admitted to the bar upon graduation from law school. When you complete law school and apply for admission to the bar, you will be asked the same character-oriented questions. Be sure to be as honest and complete in your law school application as you must be in your application for admission to the bar.

Because of the high ethical standard to which lawyers are held, the failure to disclose an act or event such as the ones described below is often more significant, and leads to more serious consequences, than the act or event itself. Failure to provide truthful answers, or failure to inform the Admissions Office of any changes to your answers, may result in the revocation of admission (without refund of tuition) or disciplinary action by the Law School, or denial of permission to practice law by the state in which you seek admission. If you answer yes to any of the following questions, you must attach a separate sheet or use an electronic attachment giving the dates, cause, outcomes, and circumstances related to the event.

APPLICATION FEE AND SIGNATURE

The application fee is waived for applicants who apply prior to January 4, 2011. After that date, a \$50 non-refundable application fee is required. Make check or money order payable to Creighton University. You may elect to submit the application and pay the fee electronically or you may print, sign, and enclose the fee with the Certification Letter, and mail it directly to the law school.
