***Note: This Program of Study includes a minimum of 375 supervised clinical hours. A minimum of 1000 credited post-baccalaureate clinical hours are required for the Doctor of Nursing Practice degree.**

**** NUR 900 is taken in 2 hour increments per semester. One hour is didactic and one is practicum (75 hours.)**

1. All **DNP students** will be required to take **two (2) of the following NDR courses** to meet the requirements for the Leadership and Policy Core Courses component of the curriculum.
 - a. NDR 600 - Dynamics of Conflict Resolution (3 Cr, F) or NDR747 (2 CR, Online)
 - b. NDR 604 - Systems and Dispute Systems Design (2 Cr, Sp) or NDR 757 (2 CR, Online)
 - c. NDR 615 - Negotiation (3 Cr, Su) or
 - d. NDR 692 - Leadership: Theories, Models, Behavior (3 Cr, F)

2. DNP students in the **Advanced Practice Nursing (APN) option will be required to take one (1)** and DNP students in the **Clinical Systems Administration (CSA) option will be required to take two (2) of following NDR courses to meet the requirements for the Role Support Courses** component of the curriculum.
 - a. NDR 606 - Cross-Cultural Perspectives in Conflict Resolution (2 Cr, Sp) or NDR 767 (2 CR, Online)
 - b. NDR 608 - Approaches for Improving Collaboration and Resolving Conflicts in Health Care Organizations (2 Cr, F) or NDR 771 (3CR, Online)
 - c. NDR 611 - Facilitation and Group Processes (2 Cr, Sp) or
 - d. *NDR 653 - Principles of Organizational Consulting for Conflict Resolution Professionals (2 Cr, Su) or
 - e. NDR 694 - Human Rights, Poverty, Medicine, and Health: An International Perspective (2 Cr, Su)

* Students cannot take NDR 757 and then take NDR 604/653.
