- f. NDR 615 - Negotiation (3 Cr, Su)
- g. NDR 692 - Leadership: Theories, Models, Behavior (3 Cr, F)
- h. *NDR 653 - Principles of Organizational Consulting for Conflict Resolution Professionals (2 Cr, Su)
- i. NDR 694 - Human Rights, Poverty, Medicine, and Health: An International Perspective (2 Cr, Su)
