


THE STUDY ABROAD PROCESS



Students interested in studying abroad should start planning 6-12 months (or earlier) before they plan to be gone. Early planning is key to a successful study abroad experience. There are many steps that you'll need to complete prior to your departure, so the earlier you start, the more time you'll have to get everything done! Remember, all students must receive study abroad approval from the OIP before applying directly to the study abroad program!

WHEN CAN I STUDY ABROAD...?

Students may choose to study abroad for a full academic year, a fall semester, a spring semester, or a few weeks during the summer. Choosing the best time to study abroad for you will depend upon your major, academic plan, and other activities in which you are involved (i.e.-athletics, student organizations, leadership positions, etc.). Most Creighton students choose to study abroad sometime during their sophomore or junior year. The Study Abroad Coordinator and your Academic Advisor can assist you in determining the best time for you to study abroad during your time at Creighton.

WILL MY FINANCIAL AID TRANSFER...?

This depends upon the type of program that you choose to participate in. Some programs allow portability of both Creighton financial aid and federal financial aid, while other programs allow portability of only federal financial aid. Some programs also allow portability of Tuition Remission and FACHEX Tuition Exchange. The Study Abroad Coordinator and the CU Financial Aid Office will be able to assist you in choosing which type of program will be most affordable for you and your family.

HOW DO I GET STARTED...?

The Study Abroad Coordinator offers "Study Abroad 101: Getting Started Sessions" each week during the academic year. You should plan to attend a session as early as possible, so that you can start planning and exploring program options. During the session, you will learn more about program options, financial aid portability, course approvals, deadlines, and the application process. We recommend attending a session one-year before you plan to go abroad. If you are not able to attend an in-person session, you may also choose to complete the online 101 tutorial.

WHAT TYPES OF PROGRAMS ARE AVAILABLE...?

Study abroad programs vary greatly in format. You might find yourself studying in a classroom with local students, studying a language with other international students, completing an internship, or volunteering in the local community. You can choose from faculty-led programs, service-learning programs, exchange programs, full-immersion programs, group-based programs, internship programs, and more!
