

Get It Off Your Chest!

Have you seen a poster like this one around campus? Or have you heard a first year student talk about a program related to alcohol use that they were asked to complete as a part of new Student Orientation? Maybe you've heard a parent mention a website about college alcohol resources for parents, or wished you had a resource for them?

These are some of the efforts that the Omaha Collegiate Consortium (OCC) has brought to Creigthon's campus. The OCC is a coalition of 8 institutions of higher education in the Omaha metro area, and is a part of the Nebraska Collegiate Consortium to Reduce High Risk Drinking (NCC), which has a total of 26 member institutions statewide. The OCC brings together representatives from each member school to share best practices related to reducing high-risk drinking among students

and to promote healthy, responsible choices related to alcohol use.

Our goal is to help each school plan and carry out activities that will work on their campus and for their students. Past activities included bystander intervention training and media campaigns. An education campaign about Nebraska's Good Samaritan Law, which went into effect in August 2015, which allows persons under 21 to seek help for themselves or a friend who is suffering from acute alcohol intoxication without fear of being cited for a Minor in Possession.

Each fall, incoming first year students complete the Year One College Alcohol Profile (Y1CAP) which helps to dispel misperceptions they may have about drinking in college, reaffirm the decision to abstain from alcohol for those who choose not to drink, and reinforces harm reduction strategies for students who do choose to drink. The OCC provides periodic social norms media campaigns in order to give students accurate information about their peers' alcohol use and acceptable behavior related to alcohol. The organization also provides training to professionals in the Center for Health and Counseling about Brief Motivational Intervention, a proven technique to help college students identify their own problems around alcohol use and develop their own plans for change. And, for parents seeking more information about how to talk to their daughter/son about alcohol use in college, a website has been developed http://powerofparenting-creighton.com.

The OCC and its activities are funded by SAMHSA's Partnership for Success Grand, and Creighton serves as the fiscal agent for the OCC. The office is located in Student Health Services in the Harper Center.
