- The Sustainability at Creighton brochure is now complete and looks great. THANK YOU to Kat Istas for creating it.
- St. Francis Day festivities:
 - o EVS Seminar
 - o 4th Annual Religion and Environment Lecture
 - o "Healing a Broken World" reading groups; approximately 30 people in attendance at each
- St. Francis Day mass: Fr. Lannon signed the <u>St. Francis Pledge to Care for Creation and the Poor</u> and presided at mass. Over 125 people were at mass; 12 Jesuits concelebrated mass.
 - Following mass, a lunch was held for approximately 100 people. Several groups across campus contributed money to purchase vegetables from Shadowbrook Farms in Lincoln; several people made salads and bread for the lunch.
