Before joining the Werner Institute faculty Mary Lee was the founding director of the Concord Center, a private non-profit conflict resolution center which offers mediation and facilitation services, as well as conflict management training to the Omaha community.

Preceding his arrival at Creighton, Ran was a Visiting Scholar and an Associate at the Program on Negotiation at Harvard Law School, where, among other projects, he helped redesign and teach the Harvard mediation course, a joint course for law and MBA students. In his research and teaching, Ran explores relational aspects of conflict engagement and aims to improve both the philosophical understanding and the practice of transformation of adversity into dialogue through mediation, negotiation and facilitation. Ran is a certified mediator trainer in Israel.
