PURPOSE

This policy explains the following requirements and benefits for students enrolled in the medical education program:

- a. Disability Insurance
- b. Health Insurance
- c. Immunization Requirements

POLICY

1. Disability Insurance

A long-term disability plan is provided to all medical students free of charge.

2. Health Insurance

The School of Medicine adheres to Creighton University's student health insurance policy and procedures. Per the policy, "Creighton University requires that all full-time students (Undergraduate = 12 credits/semester; Graduate = 8 credits/semester) be covered by a comprehensive health insurance plan* for the entire academic year." 3. Immunization Requirements

PROCEDURE

1. <u>Disability Insurance Benefits</u>

A. Benefits begin 90 days following the date of total disability and last until the student's normal social security retirement age so long as he/she remains disabled. Benefits will be paid for 24 months if the student is diagnosed with a mental, nervous, or substance abuse disorder.

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B. The benefit is \$1500 per month for M1/M2 students and \$2000 per month for M3/M4 students.

SCOPE

All students accepted and/or enrolled in the Medical Education Program.
