## **PURPOSE**

This policy defines the safety trainings students enrolled in the medical education program are required complete to advance through the curriculum.

### **POLICY**

    - iv. Children and Vulnerable Adult Training
- 2. Clerkship Phase
  - a. Disease Prevention/Infection Control
    - i. Bloodborne pathogens
    - ii. N95 Fit Testing
    - iii. Universal Precautions
    - iv. Review of the following medical education policies:
      - 1. Blood and Body Fluids Exposure Policy
      - 2. Student Exposure to Infectious and Environmental Hazards
