New Faculty Fall 2019

Leland Barker, Assistant Professor PhD, University of Nevada, Las Vegas

Leland Barker began his undergraduate education at Creighton University as a premed student, but quickly found his passion for human performance in the Department of Exercise Science and graduated in 2010. He earned his MS at California State University, Fullerton and completed his PhD in kinesiology with a focus on the biomechanics of jumping at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. While at UNLV, he also worked with Cirque de Soleil as a performance scientist and strength coach. Dr. Barker is teaching EXS 334 Biomechanics and EXS 534 Neuromechanics.

Kelley Hammond, Assistant Professor PhD, University of Alabama at Birmingham

Kelley Hammond earned her BS in Exercise Science at Creighton University in 2008. After her undergraduate studies, she moved to Tennessee, where she earned her MS in human movement science at the University of Memphis and taught in the Department of Health and Sports Science. Dr. Hammond worked as a research assistant at St. Jude's Children's Hospital before returning to graduate school at the University of Alabama at Birmingham where she earned her PhD in rehabilitation science. She completed postdoctoral training at UNLV, and was a visiting assistant professor in the Department of Kinesiology and Nutrition Science before coming to Creighton. Dr. Hammond is teaching human anatomy for nursing and OT students, and will teach EXS 350 Nutrition in the spring.

Mitchel Magrini, Assistant Professor PhD, Oklahoma State University

Mitchel Magrini earned his undergraduate degree in physical education from Doane University, a masters degree in sports medicine with an emphasis in strength and conditioning from the University of Colorado, Colorado Springs, and a PhD in health, leisure and human performance from Oklahoma State University. His research focus examines the age-related changes in neuromuscular function and how exercise interventions may improve neuromuscular performance, reduce fall risk and improve physical performance in the aging population. Dr. Magrini is teaching human anatomy for nursing (EXS 111) and EXS 335 Exercise Physiology.


EXS Alums Join the College of Arts and Sciences Alumni Advisory Council :
