RISE OF THE MOOCS: LEARNING OPPORTUNITY

The rise of Massive Online Open Courses (MOOCs) and the growth of Open Educational Resources (OER) have the potential to drive significant change in the higher education enterprise, including faculty roles, funding and budgeting, student support services, learning outcome definition and assessment, academic credit and credentialing, and the heart of the teaching and learning process.

Through informative and provocative presentations, discussions and an examination of innovative and promising practices, attendees at the 2013 Midwestern Higher Education Compact (MHEC) Annual Commission Policy Summit will consider how to position colleges, universities and higher education systems to be prepared for potential changes brought by MOOCs and OER on 1) faculty/teaching; 2) institutions/credentialing; 3) students/learning; and 4) systems/planning.




