

Did you know?


More than one in four Creighton alumni (27%) are emotionally attached to their school, compared with fewer than one in five graduates nationally (18%).*


U.S. CENSUS STATISTIC INFORMATION PROGRAM


CAI FALL SEMINAR

STUDENTS' OPINIONS ON INSTRUCTIONAL STRATEGIES

In the International Journal for the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning, Volume 9, Number 2, the article, Students' Opinions of Instructional Strategies in a Graduate-Level Creativity Course, examines a variety of instructional strategies as impetus for creative thinking and achievement in a graduate-level university course. This empiricism considers students' opinions about the strategies used and the resulting effect of the class more holistically. Results indicate that reading the textbook and writing bi-weekly reflection journals were the most valued strategies by students for elevating creative thinking.
