Pre-Dental Summer Enrichment Program for American Indian/Alaska Native Students

Disparities in oral health have been linked to a lack of diversity in the dental professions. There have been few gains in dental school enrollment of American Indian/Alaska Native (AI/AN) students. Creighton University School of Dentistry offers the only pre-dental summer enrichment program for AI/AN undergraduate students to introduce them to a dental career.

Course Description

The program was offered for 3 consecutive summers (2009-2011) with a total of 16 students. The four-week program includes lectures, hands-on labs, community engagement and shadowing in the dental school.

Course Results

Students complete a questionnaire to measure interest and understanding of dentistry as well as intent to apply to dental school Results of the five-point likert-scale questionnaire (with 5 being the highest) are as follows:

The Summer Enrichment Program	Score
provided me with a better understanding of dentistry	5.0
provided me with a better understanding of the dental school admissions process	5.0
gave me certainty that I will apply to Creighton dental school	5.0
provided an environment that was open, encouraging and respectful of me as a person	4.8
gave me certainty that I will apply to dental school	4.8
was respectful of my Native American heritage.	4.7
provided me with a better understanding of what dental school will be like	4.7



Conclusions

A summer enrichment program specifically targeting undergraduate AI/AN student with strong tribal and cultural affiliation was effective in providing a better understanding of dentistry, knowledge of the dental school admissions process and increased intention to apply to dental school.


