# Gateway Program Omaha Area Cohort

Assisting Omaha area high school seniors with the Gates Millennium Scholarship and college process

The Gateway Program is a multi-faceted program that integrates the efforts of both the Fall and Spring Break Cultural Immersions and the Omaha Area Cohort. For the Omaha Area Cohort, the Gateway Program strives to provide access to higher education for low-income minority students using the Gates Millennium Scholarship (GMS) as a vehicle for higher education.

The Gates Millennium Scholars (GMS) Program, funded by a grant from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, was established in 1999 to provide outstanding African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian Pacific Islander American, and Hispanic American students with an opportunity to complete an undergraduate college education in any discipline of interest.

## Building Dreams: The Mentor Experience

The program also relies heavily on the continued support of the Creighton community who serve as volunteers, mentors, and editors for the Gateway participants. Gateway mentors serve as role models for students engaged in the learning process and offer valuable instructional support while completing the GMS application.

#### Omaha Area Cohort

The Omaha Area Cohort consists of metropolitan area high school juniors and seniors who have demonstrated interest in the program, applied to be a participant in the Gateway Program, and meet the requirements to apply for the GMS scholarship. As a participant in the program, each student receives intensive, comprehensive support completing the GMS application and the overall college application process. Participants attend multiple monthly workshops covering topics such as resume writing, personal statement development, financial literacy, essay writing, and college selection.
