Hotel Shuttle Service

Most hotels in the Omaha area offer shuttle service to and from the airport. The shuttle may also bring you to the campus everyday. You should enquire with your hotel to arrange this service if it is available.

For those students who are staying at the Element, shuttle service is available to and from the airport and to campus. If you are requiring the Element's shuttle service to and from the airport, please

contact them as soon as possible. To arrange for this service call 402-614-8080 and talk with the front desk.

For those students staying at the Element we have already arranged a schedule for the shuttle to bring you to and from campus. On Monday, August 15 the shuttle will leave the Element hotel at 8:15 am. All other mornings, the shuttle will leave at 8:45 am.

On Tuesday, August 16 and Thursday, August 17 we will have a room available, to lock your personal belongings, for all students who will need to check out of their hotels.
