

How Can I View These Articles?

Currently, our collection of Father William F. Rigge's papers comes from a few different sources, since not all of them have been digitized or are even in our possession. Here are the various mediums through which these articles are available:

Archive.org

Archive.org is a public hosting site for historical materials. Through this system, materials are digitized and published. They have been published for educational purposes, and are expected only to be used in such a context.

This site is free for public use.

JSTOR

JSTOR is an online database of largely academic materials, such as books, articles, and reviews. The materials have been digitized and usually scanned in such a way that word searches are possible.

This site requires a membership – through either an individual or an institution – to access.

Creighton University Archives

Creighton University Archives is dedicated to collecting, preserving, and digitizing historical materials relating to the university and its community members, and in some cases, relating to Nebraska or Midwest history. In the particular case of Fr. Rigge's papers, we are still working on digitizing all of our physical copies of his works, and use the other two platforms as an intermediary until that work can be done. These files are free for the public to view, with the understanding that the information inside will be used for educational purposes only.

This site is free for public use.

Creighton Digital Repository

The Creighton Digital Repository (CDR) was created to digitize materials from Creighton University. This is an expansion of the digitization process of the Creighton University Archives, and has levels of access. Fr. Rigge's papers are public through the CDR, and the collection will be expanding over time.

This site is free for public use in this instance.
