PURPOSE

This policy defines the safety trainings students enrolled in the medical education program are required complete to advance through the curriculum.

POLICY

All students enrolled in the medical education program are required to participate in the following safety training workshops. Completion of the workshops is a requirement for satisfactory completion of each curriculum phase:
