### PROGRAM DETAILS

- Resident year is August 1–July 31.
- Resident is a Creighton University employee and receives full-time benefits through Creighton University.
- Residents complete 28–30 hours per week of clinical practice (primarily outpatient rehab) and 12–14 hours of experiences that include teaching, labs, didactic training and a common curriculum with other residency (PT and OT) programs.
- Professional licensure in the state of Nebraska is required.
