Sustainability Council minutes, February 19, 2016

Attendance: recorded at 16

- Survey: gauge sustainability literacy, gather information about transportation (to calculate greenhouse gases), learn what is important to people at Creighton. Survey closes 3/4/16, so please take the survey and encourage others to do so. https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/CU2016Sustainability
 - Approximately 600 responses so far. Approximately 1/6 are students.
 - o Students do not read CU_student_news. Students will send to RDs.
- Recyclemania: Preseason is January 24- Feb 6. Competition is February 7-April 2. Need more advertisement.
- Student update
 - Resource consumption and energy use to do a competition in the residence halls part of Earth
 Day. Some buildings are metered, some are not. Need to determine how to compare buildings –
 different types of energy and how buildings are used are complicating factors. Could match up
 two similar types of buildings (i.e. Kenefick and Heider, Opus and Davis)
 - o GreenThumbs are getting up and running to do some gardening on campus, including medical students.
 - Composting: IRHG submitted information to Sodexo, but Sodexo needs more support. A "soft opening" in Becker and Brandeis over the summer. Compost could be used on campus, if they are able to bring it full-circle.

- Purchasing study update. This study focused on identifying perceptions, attitudes and behaviors of
 employees who are the decision makers for purchasing office supplies. Creighton was one of five
 universities to participate in the study. This research was funded by a United States Environmental
 Protection Agency (EPA) grant where the ultimate outcome of understanding these perceptions and
 attitudes could possibly lead to recommendation altering policy and purchasing practices. The study was
 conducted by the Nebraska Business Development Center (NBDC) at the University of Nebraska at
 Omaha (UNO), in conjunction with procurement and sustainability officials at Creighton University.

The main things we learned from the study are:

- People are willing to buy environmentally preferable products
- People are still not getting enough feedback that they should buy environmentally preferable products
- Policies of only purchasing recycled-content paper and reducing deliveries to once per week would be accepted and would reduce Creighton's carbon footprint

Creighton lowered its environmental impact primarily through purchasing less paper. Savings from academic year 2013-14 to 2014-15 were (papercalculator.org):

- \$16,846
- 55 tons of wood
- 491 million BTUs of energy
- 38.3 metric tons greenhouse gas emissions,
- 343,146 gallons of water
- 28,884 pounds of solid waste

As a part of the study, purchasers received monthly bulletins informing them of different aspects of purchasing green. These bulletins have been distilled into smaller tips that are posted in Creighton Today every 2 weeks.

- A group of faculty, staff and students will be traveling to the Loyola-Chicago AJCU sustainability conference in March.
- STARS (Sustainability Tracking Assessment and Reporting System) is almost complete. Thank you to all
 who collaborated on this tremendous undertaking. The data is also used for Princeton Review and Sierra
 Club Cool Schools.

 - Need to talk to admissions about how students are more involved in sustainability
- Katherine Osterman to talk about US Green Building Council and opportunities to interact.
 - Works at Kiewit as a commissioning engineer; is on the board of the US Green Building Council Flatwater Chapter. Doing advocacy and outreach – Emerging Professionals and Students Committee Chair. Wants to be a resource at Creighton.
