 Organizer-paid is a simple option by which the partnering business or organization provides the passes to interested participants at no cost. The employer's purchases are fully tax deductible and are not included as gross income for employees.

Employee pre-tax allows employees to use pre-tax income to purchase their individual passes, therefore reducing both taxable income and payroll taxes.

Cost-Sharing splits the cost of the passes between the partnering organization and its participants, combining the tax advantages of the first and second payment options.

This is something that Sustainability Council could partner with Staff Advisory Council (SAC) on. SAC would need us to bring a proposal and present to them what the plan is and its implications on the University and for our interest, staff.

The group liked the pre-tax option, but HR feels that it would be too expensive to administer through Payflex (approximately \$500 set-up fee, plus \$75/per person that uses the service to administer). We are wondering if there's a way to offer passes at a discount to faculty, staff and students. Mary Duda will contact Metro to see what the options are.

- CCSJ has students interns that are interested in working on sustainability. They have a list of items they want to work on this year:
 - Getting rid of disposable plastic water bottles. Need infrastructure (places to fill reusable bottles) in place first.
 - o Composting
 - o Reusable bags for grab-and-go
 - Double-sided printing in the library
 - o Bringing back Meatless Mondays with more information/education

The group offered ideas, information and suggestions for the CCSJ students. Purchasing is exploring replacing the large (5-gallon) water bottles in offices with plumbed filtration.

Further support and help for the endeavors is appreciated.
