### **PURPOSE**

The house staff physician shall remain free to utilize his/her off-duty time as he/she deems appropriate, so long as such activity does not interfere with the ability of the resident to achieve the goals and objectives of the educational program and must not interfere with the resident's fitness for work nor compromise patient safety. All moonlighting and volunteering hours must be counted towards the 80-hour maximum weekly duty hour limit.

### **SCOPE**

This policy applies to all Creighton University Urology Residency Program.

### **POLICY**

### **DEFINITIONS**

- **External moonlighting:** Voluntary, compensated, medically-related work performed outside the institution where the resident is in training or at any of its related participating sites.
- **Internal Moonlighting:** Voluntary, compensated, medically-related work (not related with training requirements) performed within the institution in which the resident is in training or at any of its related participating sites.

### **POLICY**

#### **Department of Urology Moonlighting Policy**

Although Creighton University neither encourages nor discourages moonlighting, residents in the Urology program are prohibited from moonlighting during their residency.
