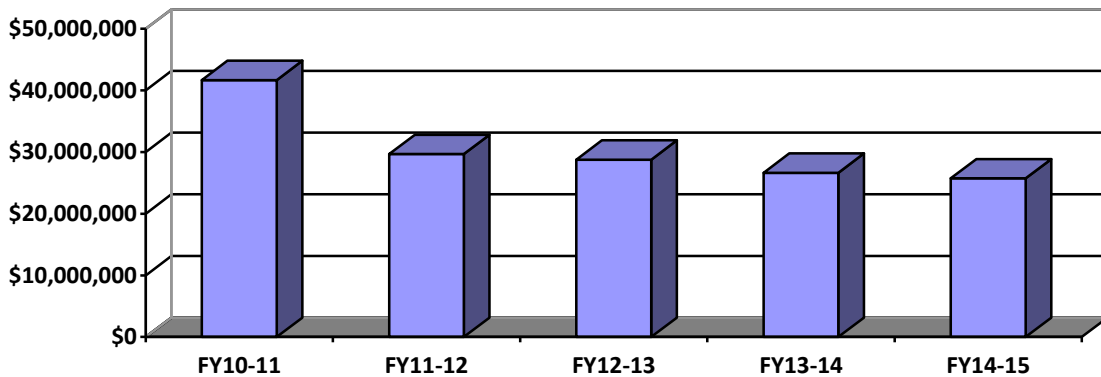

¹ The completion of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) accounts for some of the drop in the amount of external funding. Creighton received more than \$8 million of ARRA funding from the initial enactment date of May 1, 2009 through June 30, 2011. Additionally, Creighton also received nearly \$4 million in congressional earmarks from September 1, 2009 to June 30, 2011.
