Since opening in 1961, the staff of Reinert-Alumni Memorial Library have had a basic purpose: ***To serve the Creighton community in ways that promote academic excellence.***

Our staff collaborates with faculty to develop collections that anticipate the research and classroom needs of both professors and students.

The Library's website facilitates online learning with web-based guides, tutorials and electronic collections.

Our reciprocal borrowing agreements allow Creighton faculty and students to utilize other Jesuit and Nebraska library resources, while allowing our staff to serve a broader population.



The Library and the University Archives provide information, photographs, and other assistance to researchers from Creighton, the United States, Canada and Europe.

Students from across campus use the Library's computer equipment, which includes IBM and Apple workstations, laptops, printers and a new scanning station (shown here).



The Information Literacy program enables students to recognize when information is needed and have the ability to locate, evaluate, and use effectively the necessary material.

Through the popular Research Assistance Program (RAP), reference librarians work one-on-one with students to find the resources needed for research projects (at left).

Library and University Archives staff lead classroom sessions for many courses each semester.
