Marianne Culhane, J.D.

Michael Flecky, S.J.

In 1966, the poet Denise Levertov wrote: “It is hard to be an artist in this time because it is hard to be human: in the dull ever-accumulating horror of the war news, it is more difficult each day to keep remembering the creative and joyful potential of human beings, and to fulfill that potential in one’s own life, as testimony ...”

Today Levertov’s observations remain salient. Nevertheless, Father Michael Flecky of the Society of Jesus makes incarnate a mode of artistry marked by clarity of vision, kind mentorship, natural humility, and an unflinching sense of humor.

An Omaha native, Professor Flecky earned his undergraduate and master’s degrees from St. Louis University, his master’s in divinity at the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley, and his MFA in photography from the Rochester Institute of Technology.

He has over 34 years of academic service to the University and has served as a visiting professor of fine arts at Richmond College in London. He has been awarded artist in residence fellowships no fewer than seven times.

The proverb “The eyes are the windows of the soul,” suggests that by looking into the eyes of another, we can see who or what they are. In Fr. Flecky’s case, we meet his soul not only by looking into his eyes; for, through his photographs, we behold the breadth of vision and the crystalline purity of how he sees the world. Though he may not put it this way, by looking through Mike’s eyes, we can begin to understand that God continues to take delight in creation, to look at this world and to see it as very good.

Because his life and work manifest excellence in character, loyalty, service and scholarship, he is properly admitted to Alpha Sigma Nu.

There are award winners where it is easy to see all of their accomplishments listed in a curriculum vitae or other type of program. But the most difficult people to honor are those who quietly and selflessly give of themselves, their time and their resources to help those in need. Dr. Robert N. Troia is one such individual.

An Omaha native, Dr. Troia received his pre-medical education at the University of Notre Dame and his M.D. from Creighton University in 1979. He practiced as a pediatric ophthalmologist with his father for many years and currently maintains a local practice with his brother.

Dr. Troia is considered a leader in his profession. He has served as president of the Nebraska Academy of Ophthalmology; as chair of surgery at Children's Hospital; and at Creighton in multiple roles, his most favored -- teaching Creighton students and residents.

Furthermore, Dr. Troia has been an active volunteer and coach with Special Olympics as well as a quiet and generous supporter of many organizations in the community.

A colleague describes Dr. Troia (Bob) as understated, kind and thoughtful; a person whose judgment on various issues is consistently impeccable and to the point; a person for whom scholarship, loyalty and service have echoed throughout his life's work.
