Russell Hopp, D.O.

Dr. Russell Hopp, D.O., holds appointments as Professor of Pediatrics and Medicine, Creighton University School of Medicine, and as Director of Pediatric Allergy at Creighton, UNMC, and Children's Hospital. Since that time Dr. Hopp has trained over 30 fellows, hundreds of residents and thousands of medical students, and has published over 300 scholarly articles, abstracts, and book chapters.

Dr. Hopp's record of service includes leadership positions in numerous local and national professional organizations, including the Nebraska State Board of Health and the American Lung Association. Dr. Hopp has consistently volunteered in multiple advisory positions, such as Omaha Asthma Alliance, Metro Omaha Tobacco Awareness Coalition, and Camp SuperKids. Dr. Hopp has also served as a Creighton Athletics team doctor for 25 years.

Ann Laughlin, PhD, RN

Dr. Ann Laughlin, Professor of Nursing at Creighton University, truly lives Ignatian values. A two-time graduate of Creighton, Dr. Laughlin has been teaching at Creighton since 1990. In her faculty role Dr. Laughlin has obtained numerous external grants, published in refereed journals, authored three book chapters, and logged 44 scholarly presentations. She has guided more than 20 doctoral nursing students, and serves as a nurse for retired Jesuits in the Creighton Jesuit Community.

Dr. Laughlin is an inspirational advocate for the health care needs of the underserved and a leader in connecting Creighton with our local community. Dr. Laughlin was the principal proponent for creating two Omaha-area initiatives that greatly impact the health of vulnerable populations while providing extraordinary learning experiences for health care students. First, Dr. Laughlin led in developing the Creighton School Health Program (CSHP), which filled the gap when local government eliminated funding for school nurses in many low-income schools. Since its inception, the program has grown to provide 30 schools, serving approximately 9,000 students, with health care screening and care.

Second, Dr. Laughlin brokered an innovative mission-linked partnership with Heart Ministry Center in which diverse low-income populations receive free services from Creighton faculty and students, regardless of health insurance. Originally focused on health care, the Porto Clinic, which Dr. Laughlin manages, provides individuals with nursing, pharmacy, medical, dental, occupational and physical therapy, social and mental health work, and legal services. During 2016, the clinic provided no-cost services valued at \$154,000 to over 1,000 patients.

Dr. Laughlin has received numerous honors – recognition as a Robert Wood Johnson National Community Health Leader finalist in 2009; Mary Lucretia Creighton Award in 2013; the American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy Student Community Engaged Service Award in 2015; and the Heart Ministry Volunteer of the Year Award in 2017.

Dr. Laughlin clearly lives the Ignatian values of Magis, Women & Men for and with Others, and Cura Personalis. She constantly forms and educates students to be agents of change. Alpha Sigma Nu is delighted to induct her as an honorary member.

Tom Murray, PhD

Thomas F. Murray, Ph.D., University Provost, joined Creighton in 2006 as the Chair of the Department of Pharmacology in the School of Medicine following faculty appointments at Washington State University, Oregon State University and the University of Georgia. Dr. Tilleman was appointed to the Creighton School of Pharmacy faculty in December 2003, specializing in Professional Development, Clinical Skills, and Service Learning. She has been awarded 10 teaching awards since 2005. Her integration of service learning, Ignatian values and reflection was innovative well before it became popular in pharmacy education. Jenny has experienced Ignatian formation programs herself, and has embraced Jesuit core values in her life and work. She has integrated Jesuit ideals into her courses, whether as specific lectures or as ongoing and systematic reflection exercises. She is the first to volunteer to support student activities, to integrate academic and campus ministry, and to involve the students in community education.

Dr. Tilleman's teaching involves her with her students' goals and their personal and professional development. It is no surprise that Jenny is regularly invited to provide lectures and lead discussions on Ignatian values not only in seminars for health science students and faculty but also in Arts and Sciences freshman seminars.

That same Ignatian spirit carries over naturally into widespread and energetic service to her profession, Creighton, St. John's Parish, and the community. She was awarded the Spirit of St. Ignatius award in 2008 and has continued to increase her service since then. A primary example of Dr. Tilleman's commitment to Ignatian ideals has been the annual Lakota Immersion Trip. She participated in 2008 and 2009, and then took over the program in 2013 as the leader.

Whether she is sponsoring tables for Social Justice fund raising, building a scholarship fund, volunteering at Project Homeless, serving as the liturgical assistant at St. John's and University-wide masses, or counseling a student, Dr. Tilleman is a humble person who generously answers the call to live for and with others. The Creighton Chapter enthusiastically welcomes Dr. Jennifer Tilleman as an honorary member of Alpha Sigma Nu.
