She also serves as a tutor, a volunteer in the Omaha community, and enjoys working as a pharmacy intern.

Paige Saunier

Paige is a third-year student and will graduate this coming May 2021 with her doctorate in occupational therapy. She has been involved in a variety of activities at Creighton University and served as the Pharmacy Health Professions Student Government Representative and secretary of Creighton University Student Occupational Therapy Association. She is an active member of the occupational therapy honor society Pi Theta Epsilon, Iota Chapter, as well as a volunteer in the Omaha community.

Skyler Starkel

Skyler is a third-year pharmacy student. She serves as the Creighton University Student Representative on the Nebraska Pharmacist Association Board of Directors, a student member on the Creighton University Pharmacy Assessment Committee, and as an officer of Creighton's Magis Clinic at the Siena Francis House. Honorary Inductees

Laura Heinemann, PhD, MSW

*Associate Professor in Medical Anthropology and Medical Humanities
College of Arts and Sciences and School of Medicine*

Laura Heinemann, associate professor of medical anthropology and medical humanities with appointments in the College of Arts and Sciences and School of Medicine, has conducted timely research examining lives of organ transplant recipients and their caregivers, in order to better understand the motivations, joys and struggles of caregiving in the community. Her resulting book publication made a strong case for comprehensive health policy that treats health care as a shared public responsibility informing debates on health care reform. An iteration of this work was published in the flagship publication of the Society for Medical Anthropology, the *Medical Anthropology Quarterly*.

Her recent sabbatical approached caregiving in the community and its impact on health care/health policy from a more general angle, exploring caregiving after hospital discharges. Considering the ongoing health care policy discussion in the United States and that a significant number of Creighton undergraduate students discern a career in health care, her scholarship easily connects with students' interests and challenges them to think broadly about health care and keeping "care" in health care.

Heinemann is strongly committed to Ignatian charisms. Her research, her leadership as department chair for three years, her teaching, and her mentorship are rooted in a desire to be a person who lives "for and with others." She is a kind person who prioritizes and celebrates the growth and achievement of others, be it colleagues or students, and tries her best to help others thrive and overcome obstacles. Heinemann genuinely exercises *cura personalis*, recognizing the strengths of others and helping them address challenges and limitations. Students are drawn to her because of her kind and supportive nature. She always challenges herself and others to give their best, striving for excellence through *magis*. This is evident in her scholarship, in her mentorship of students, and in her relationship with colleagues.

Meghan Potthoff, PhD, APRN-NP, PPCNP-BC, CPNP-AC

Associate Professor, College of Nursing

Meghan Potthoff, associate professor, pediatric nurse practitioner, actively integrates her scholarship and clinical practice with her teaching of Doctor of Nursing Practice students. Potthoff and her team successfully competed for a \$100,000 grant awarded by the National Center for Interprofessional Practice and Education in partnership with leading health care foundations. The project focused on creating one of the first collaborative care models based on a Relative Value Unit (RVU) model to improve patient health outcomes in the Creighton University Clinic Family Practice Department. Under Potthoff's leadership, the team implemented a novel interdisciplinary approach to patient care, engaging Creighton Werner Institute's conflict management expertise to assist health professionals to appreciate each other's perspectives and expertise. The findings were published in the prestigious *Annals of Family Medicine*, and a second manuscript has been accepted by the *Journal of Interprofessional Care*.

As an emerging leader in pediatric palliative care research, Potthoff is currently a Sojourn Scholar, nationally selected by the Cambia Health Foundation to receive \$180,000 over two years. Her contributions to the developing body of pediatric palliative care nursing knowledge include 11 publications in peer-reviewed journals in the past three years, service on the editorial board of Building Healthy Academic Communities, and reviewing for *The Journal for Palliative Medicine*. In 2019 she was inducted as the inaugural College of Nursing Lenke Scholar. Potthoff was awarded Nurse of the Year for Academic Excellence by the March of Dimes in 2014 and nominated again in 2020 for Nurse Practitioner Excellence.

Loyalty and service activities include past chair Midwest chapter, National Association of Pediatric Nurse Practitioners; volunteer with St. Robert Bellarmine church and Partnership for Kids, board member of the Kyle Korver Foundation and co-chair of six annual fundraisers; member of the Creighton Young Alumni Board; and fundraising for the Russell Child Development Center.

Lorraine (Lori) Rusch, PhD, RN

Associate Professor, College of Nursing

Lori Rusch exemplifies Creighton's service mission through dedication to her nursing profession, leadership, teaching, and scholarship. For 11 years, Rusch was integral in recruiting and developing faculty from seven health professions to provide team-based, patient-focused care at Project Homeless Connect Omaha (PHCO). Her forward thinking infused an interprofessional education model into PHCO operations long before it was required by the Health Science schools. While Rusch prioritized the needs of the PHCO guests experiencing homelessness, she emphasized student education and Jesuit values-based personal and professional formation.

Rusch was principal or co-investigator on eight grants with local, regional, and international presentations. Currently, she is lead investigator of a Haddix President's Faculty Research grant, "Exploring the Use of Mobile Health Technology in Heart Failure Self-Care Management." She was also recently awarded a Teaching and Learning Center Development grant, "Exploring Effective Practices and Outcomes for Collaborative Learning and Leadership Teaching Strategies."

Her student nominator wrote, "Dr. Rusch's commitment to her students' learning allows us to grow in both our didactic and practical education. As the course leader of our senior-level care management course, Rusch supports the success of students by making herself available for questions and always encouraging deeper engagement with the material. Rusch guides meaningful simulation activities that encourage critical thinking coupled with compassionate patient care. In this way, Rusch practices *cura personalis*, caring for her students' educationally and in terms of personal growth and development. She takes a genuine interest in the lives of all students, seeing us as unique individuals and always offering to provide assistance where appropriate. As an advisor for undergraduate students in the College of Nursing, Rusch supports her student's goals and promotes academic success by providing them with guidance through the roadblocks they may face."

Dzao C. Vũ, SJ, PharmD, MPH

Jesuit Regent

Instructor, School of Pharmacy and Health Professions

Dzao Vŭ, SJ, PharmD, now in the regency period of his Jesuit formation, lives in the Jesuit community at Creighton Hall. Ahead lie studies in theology, ordination to the transitional diaconate and then, in approximately three years, ordination to the priesthood.

Vũ, now 44, came to the United States with his mother, his carpenter father who spent eight years in a Vietnamese “re-education” camp, and one other sibling. Two older siblings would join them later, courtesy of a family reunification program sponsored by the late U.S. Sen. John McCain, R-Ariz. A third sibling remains in Vietnam, where she is married.

When the Vŭ family arrived in Houston in 1992 as beneficiaries of an agreement between Vietnam and the U.S. that permitted Vietnamese emigration, they immediately joined one of 10 Vietnamese parishes. The search for employment soon led the family to Omaha where Vŭ’s parents, now 80 and 83, still reside.

The road from that day to Vŭ’s commitment to the Jesuit path in 2014 has been winding. He attended Omaha Central High School, where he often gazed over Creighton’s campus, never dreaming his future lie there. He earned his pharmacy doctorate at the University of Nebraska Medical Center. Then, a memorable conversation with Creighton Jesuit the Rev. Larry Gillick, SJ, assisted by friendships with Vietnamese Jesuit scholastics, followed by work as a pharmacist in Las Vegas, led him to a decision that the priestly life was his calling.

“I had established a career as a pharmacist, but I thought to myself, ‘Well, what is the purpose of my life?’ I felt a call to a deeper vocation. I decided to maximize my gifts by becoming a Jesuit—to educate, to serve and to help the less fortunate.”
