

## **COVID-19 Checklist**

# I was identified as a <u>close contact</u> to someone who tested positive for COVID-19. What should I do?

- 1. Contact your health care provider, especially if you have an underlying health issue or are considered high risk, and follow any directives. (Students can contact Student Health Education and Compliance/SHEC at <a href="mailto:StudentHealth@creighton.edu">StudentHealth@creighton.edu</a>.)
- 2. If you develop symptoms, DO NOT COME TO CAMPUS. (If you live on campus, remain in your residence hall room.) Schedule a COVID-19 test. (Employees should notify their supervisors, and students should notify their instructors.)
- 3. Quarantine according to the guidance below.

# Students, faculty and staff not working with patients

- If you are unvaccinated or if you are more than 6 months past your second dose of Pfizer or Moderna or 2 months past your J&J vaccine and have not obtained a booster shot – you should quarantine for 5 days and then continue to wear a face covering for an additional 5 days.
- > If you are fully vaccinated and have received a COVID-19 booster shot, you do not need to quarantine but should wear a face covering when around others for 10 days following an exposure.
- > For all those exposed, the CDC recommends a COVID-19 test 5 days after exposure. (The date of exposure is considered day 0.)

### Health sciences students, faculty and staff working with patients

Applies to all students, faculty and staff in medicine, nursing, dentistry, pharmacy, physical therapy, occupational therapy, physician assistant, and Emergency Medical Services/EMS programs who are working with patients.

- If you are unvaccinated or if you are more than 6 months past your second dose of Pfizer or Moderna or 2 months past your J&J vaccine **and** have not obtained a booster shot – you should quarantine for 10 days. You can discontinue quarantine with a negative antigen test on day 7.
- > If you are fully vaccinated and have received a COVID-19 booster shot, you do not need to quarantine but should test on day 2 and once again on day 5-7 (the date of exposure is considered day 0).
- > If you are involved in clinical work, consult with your clinical location for further guidance.

#### **Students please note:**

- > Course attendance policy governs short-term absences. Students who miss class should consult course syllabi to make up work.
- > Notify your instructors when you plan to return to campus.
- > If you are a residential student living on campus, and have questions regarding your quarantine, please contact your Resident Director.
- > If you are involved in clinical work, consult with your clinical location for further guidance.
