

COVID-19 Checklist

What should I do if I was in close contact with someone with COVID-19?

- 1. If you develop symptoms, DO NOT COME TO CAMPUS; if you live on campus, remain in your residence hall room; schedule a COVID-19 test; and notify your supervisor/instructors.
- 2. If you have questions, contact your health care provider, especially if you have an underlying health issue or are considered high risk, and follow any directives. (Students can contact Student Health Education and Compliance/SHEC at StudentHealth@creighton.edu.)
- 3. Follow the guidance below.

Day of Exposure (Day 0)

If you were unmasked and were within 6 feet of someone with COVID-19 for a total of 15 minutes or more on any day that they may have been infectious, you should **monitor** and **wear a face covering** for at least 10 days.

If you are not vaccinated or not boosted in accordance with <u>CDC guidance</u>, stay home for 5 days, monitor and wear a face covering for at least 10 days. If you cannot stay home for 5 days, wear a face covering around others for 10 days.

Day 5

Get tested, if possible.

- > If you test positive: Follow Creighton's guidance. Stay home, wear a face covering and tell your close contacts.
- > If you test negative: Resume normal activities and continue to wear a face covering around others.

Day 10

Last day of wearing a face covering around others if asymptomatic.

Students please note:

- > Course attendance policy governs short-term absences. Students who miss class should consult course syllabi to make up work.
- > Notify your instructors when you plan to return to campus.
- > If you are involved in clinical work in a health care setting, consult with your clinical location for further guidance and follow the more stringent guidelines.
