



COVID-19 Checklist

What if I'm feeling ill or experiencing COVID-19 symptoms?

1. If you are feeling ill, **DO NOT COME TO CAMPUS.**
2. Notify your instructors and/or supervisors regarding your absence.
3. If you have [symptoms that are consistent with possible COVID-19 infection](#), please follow the guidance below.

- > Obtain a COVID-19 test. (See testing options below.)
- > Wear a face covering, stay home and separate yourself from other people, pending your test result.
- > Contact your health care provider or the [CHI Health Clinic – Student Care Clinic](#) and follow the directives of your health care provider.

Testing Options

- > COVID-19 at-home test kits are available for purchase on the Omaha campus at the [McGloin Market, Jack and Ed's Marketplace](#), online, in pharmacies and in retail stores.

- > Creighton is working with CHI Health to provide convenient, accessible COVID-19 testing at CHI Health Creighton University Medical Center-University Campus, adjacent to the Omaha campus, on 24th and Cuming streets.
 - Students can call the [CHI Health Student Care Clinic](#) at 402.280.2735 (option 2) to make an appointment with a provider, or, if registered with CHI's My Chart Patient Portal, use that system to report their symptoms and request a COVID-19 test.
 - [CHI Health Priority Care Clinic-University Campus](#) is another option for students, faculty and staff to see a provider and request a COVID-19 test. The Priority Care Clinic is open 8 a.m.-8 p.m. every day. No appointment necessary.
 - All provider appointments and COVID-19 testing charges will be billed to your insurance. More detailed information is available on the COVID-19 website under "Testing and Vaccinations."
