What is Alpha Sigma Nu?

Alpha Sigma Nu is the honor society of Jesuit institutions of higher education. The Society recognizes those students who distinguish themselves in scholarship, loyalty and service. Alpha Sigma Nu is unique among honor societies in that it seeks to identify the most promising students of Jesuit colleges and universities who demonstrate an intelligent appreciation of and commitment to Jesuit ideals. The only honor society permitted to bear the name Jesuit, Alpha Sigma Nu encourages its members to a lifetime pursuit of intellectual development, deepening Ignatian spirituality, service to others, and a commitment to the core principles of Jesuit education. Selection to Alpha Sigma Nu is one of the highest honors awarded on a Jesuit campus.

Who is eligible to join?

Juniors, seniors, and students in graduate and professional schools who rank in the top 15 percent of their classes may be considered for membership. Each chapter can nominate no more than 4 percent of their junior and senior classes from each school and college of a university. The method of selection varies from campus to campus but is always based on scholarship, loyalty, and service. Chapters also may initiate honorary members-persons who display the outstanding qualities sought in Alpha Sigma Nu members.

A Brief History

Alpha Sigma Nu was founded in 1915 at Marquette University. The men's honor society, known as Alpha Sigma Tau until 1930, spread from Marquette to Creighton University, to Saint Louis University, and to the University of Detroit in its first decade. In 1924, Gamma Pi Epsilon was founded to honor outstanding women. Alpha Sigma Nu and Gamma Pi Epsilon pursued separate but similar paths for almost 50 years, expanding nationally and cooperating on campuses where they existed together. The society born of their merger in 1973 is open to men and women at chapters on all 27 Jesuit campuses in the United States, two in Canada, one in South Korea, one in Spain and one in Peru. Over 2,000 members are inducted each year.

Director of Communications, University Communications and Marketing

Davis has been on staff at Creighton for more than 29 years, starting at the University in 1994 after working as a newspaper journalist and editor.

Julie A. Manz, PhD, MS'05, BSN'98, RN

Professor, College of Nursing

Dr. Manz' scholarship started with the classroom and has reached far beyond those beginnings. She has achieved international recognition of her scholarship, including a multitude of invitations for consultation. The major focus of her research trajectory is conceptualization, development, testing, and implementation of the Creighton Competency Evaluation Instrument (CCEI). This is an assessment rubric to evaluate student performance in clinical activities, specific to the competencies outlined in the American Academy Colleges of Nursing Essentials. Permission to use the CCEI has been requested by 323 college and universities, 53 health systems and the US Air Force and National League for Nursing. Requests for use have also come from 657 individuals, from all 50 states, Washington, D.C. and Puerto Rico. The CCEI has been translated into eight languages and used internationally in 22 countries. It is one of the leading, if not the leading, tools for assessment of clinical skills and knowledge.

Dr. Manz joined the Creighton faculty in 2003 and has progressed to the rank of full professor and is an Assistant Dean. She is a servant leader and demonstrates development of her faculty. She is highly respected by students, faculty and leadership.

One of Dr. Manz's notable service contributions was her co-direction of the Creighton University COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic which led to vaccination of greater than 42,500 residents of Douglas County, many of whom were from disadvantaged areas near Creighton.

Dr. Manz's accomplishments embody the Jesuit values and the Alpha Sigma Nu ideals of scholarship, loyalty and service.

Paul L. Price, PharmD'92

Associate Professor, Department of Pharmacy Practice Senior Associate Dean, School of Pharmacy and Health Professions

Dr. Price has been a faculty member in the School of Pharmacy and Health Professions since 2000 and serves as the Senior Associate Dean while maintaining his clinical practice as a psychiatric pharmacist at CHI Health Immanuel Medical Center and Lasting Hope Recovery Center. Price sits on several committees at the University.He is instrumental in providing pharmacy services at the Magis Clinic as a regular volunteer.With his leadership, the clinic established a licensed pharmacy.Paul is an active member of his parish, St. Stephan the Martyr, as a welcoming minister and Stephan's Minister.And, he is a member of the Knights of Columbus and has served many years as the faculty advisor for the council at Creighton
