Creighton University uses a curriculum developed in accord with local and national Community Health Worker (CHW) Core Competencies

CHWs receive over 150 hours of training

- Over 100 hours of instruction through presentations, small group learning, and case studies.
- Over 30 hours of self-guided study and work
- 80 CHWs are trained and certified at the end of each cohort
- Monthly stipend for all trainees who participate in the program

Of the 80 certified CHWs, 15 work with state-wide partners as full-time apprentices, certified with the Department of Labor.

- Apprentices receive an additional 2,000 hours of on-the-job training and mentoring.
- Apprentices are guaranteed at least a \$16/hour wage to start, with an increase after 6 months.

As part of this program, you will be invited to participate in research to help understand the role of CHWs in reducing health disparities and the effectiveness of CHW training programs. You can still participate in the program without participating in the research component.
