PURPOSE

This policy details the appropriate dress required at the clinical campuses within the medical education program.

POLICY

Medical Education Program students on clinical rotations are required to adhere to the dress code of the appropriate clinical affiliate. Students are expected to wear their white coats in patient care areas, unless involved in procedures requiring a sterile environment. **White coats should display the Creighton patch and should only have a name tag attached. Pins from a medical professional society may be attached to the lapel.**
